THE COMMUNITY

Morgantown, home to West Virginia University, is situated on the Monongahela River in the Appalachian Mountains. The city is located at the intersection of Interstates 79 and 68, seventy miles south of Pittsburgh, PA. In addition to WVU, the major employers of the 40,000 residents are: Consolidated Coal Company, Monongalia Health Systems, Mylan Pharmaceuticals, WVU Medical Corporation, Monongalia County Board of Education, and Morgantown Energy Technology Center.

Morgantown was named "Best Small City in America" by Demographics Daily based on traits such as vitality, supply of good jobs, freedom from stress, connection to cultural mainstream, support for schools, access to health care, low cost of living and small town character.

THE SCHOOL

MHS is a comprehensive public High School. For 2020-21 school year the total enrollment is approximately 1875 students in grades 9 through 12. Accredited by the Office of Educational Performance and the WV State Department of Education, MHS is a WV School of Excellence and a Benedum Professional Development School. MHS has been recognized by Newsweek and US News & World Report as one of the Best High Schools in the Nation, and has received recognition as the #1 High School in WV.

THE FACULTY

A faculty of 120 includes five principals, five counselors and 1 media specialist. The faculty at Morgantown High averages 25 years of teaching experience and are proud to Honor 12 Nationally Board Certified Teachers.

THE SCHEDULE DESIGN

MHS has a modified block schedule. Students are scheduled for eight full-year classes, one of which may be a study period. Classes meet for 90 minutes each, every other day. The schedule rotates an odd (1, 3, 5, and 7) period/even (2, 4, 6, and 8) period design.
